A Living Hope

The thanksgiving we share, God, has to do with how You have made and remade us. You formed us in Your Likeness then gave us one another to make sure we followed in the way You wanted. In Christ, the risen Lord, You made it possible for us to move beyond the ordinariness of life, with its minor triumphs and major aggravations, to a life with everything to live for.

We thank You, God, for all those who brought us that new expanding word: partnrs, friends, people of faith whom we know...those who gave us this great heritage. There are those who stand close to us in times of celebration and trial, in times of accomplishments and defeat, in times of moral integrity and in time when we have been more wrong than right in our behavior.

Yes, there have been those who have told us *Bravo!* and those who have told us, *You are headed in the wrong direction.* For all of them, we thank You.

We thank you for those experiences when we hear and understand, for we do not always listen—we sometimes are so bound up in our own concerns we forget about those who most deeply care for us. That includes our response to the Risen Lord. We lock ourselves away because of fear or lack of faith. However, when He stands right here, we still doubt and must test and prove. And He says, "*That's OK.*" In that response is the invitation to lay aside our doubts and fears. We are touched even as we are touching. Then we believe and respond with Peter's assurance, *We will love and trust Him.*

So we pray that we might be blessed with patience and understanding partners and friends, people of faith journeying with us so that in turn we are blessed as the patient and understanding friend or partner renewing each others' lives.

We pray that in our life with others, we concentrate on the better so that the worst becomes the best, new life in Christ.

Now, knowing that Jesus Christ walks with us and for us, and by us, we pray a prayer he taught us, which reminds us that life with You, God, is intended to be enriched, enabled and ennobled. So with these words we declare our partnership of faith, hope and love through Jesus Christ as we pray together, "Our Father..."




Staff Appreciation Month

Soup Kitchen

BY THE NUMBERS Our St. Andrew By-the-Sea Soup Kitchen by year end will:

1. Provide nutritious groceries to over 14,000 family members from our twice weekly Harvest Table distribution. Estimated retail cost of produce distributed is \$3000 weekly.
2. Prepare and serve over 8,000 nutritious well-balanced lunches at a cost of \$2.50 each.
3. Distribute 100 pieces of men's, women's and children's clothing each week to our guests.
4. Provide diapers for 20 children.

We have expanded our outreach significantly this year, and are now the largest and only agency on the island that provides both To-Go lunches on Tuesdays and Fridays, as well as hot sit-down meals on Fridays. We have a very long plentiful Harvest Table filled with a large variety of pantry items both days provided by Deep Well (non-perishables), Second Helpings (perishables), and local gardeners in our group bring their in-season produce. Crumbl Cookie has just joined the list of donations. Some items are purchased for cost through the generosity of David Martin (St. Andrew member) at Piggly Wiggly. The Harvest Table is like a mini-grocery store. We also use these items to fill our Blessing Box that is in the parking lot with 24/7 availability to those in need.

OUR MORNINGS START AT 8:00 AM when our doors open to guests for hot coffee, juice, milk or water along with a few goodies provided from the Harvest Table, Starbuck's, or Crumbl Cookies. It is a festive and welcoming atmosphere that brings our guests together for conversation. A couple of our guests help with the clothes distribution area that is also open at that time. We call it Mary's Closet in honor of our Mary who has taken it on as her volunteer job. There are toys, books, and bikes for the little ones.

Before we serve, we always have a large Prayer Circle, and new guests are introduced and welcomed. We hold hands and have prayers in Spanish and English. Our guests are then given random numbers and form a line to get their groceries. Newcomers get to go first! On the first Friday of each month, we have a Birthday Celebration with a song, cake, candles, and hats. Birthday people go for groceries first!

TUESDAY SK HOURS ARE 8:00 TO 10:15 AM. Tuesday serves between 20 and 45 guests. Many Tuesday volunteers donate the bread, meat, and cheese to make the sandwiches, as well as chips, fruit, and cookies. On the last Friday of each month, Stu's Surfside Subs provides 40 half subs. There has also been a hot meal donated by The Salty Dog this summer.


FRIDAY SK HOURS ARE 8:00 TO 11:30 AM. Four dedicated cooks and food preppers arrive early to start the hot meal. We serve the sit-down hot meal to between 30-40 guests. Volunteers help with the hot

meal prep, assemble the To-Go bags, keep the coffee pots filled, and set the tables with seasonal tablecloths and decorations. We also now have a husband-and-wife dishwasher team! Hot food is served at 10:30. Servings of the hot meal are also boxed up to be put in the To-Go bags. Once a month we have a hot meal donated by one of our local restaurants such as Woody's, Salty Dog, One Hot Mama's, or a local country club.

OUR WONDERFUL VOLUNTEERS come from all over the island, many different faiths, people who just saw the sign and came in to see if we needed help, some from WAHHI, some are neighbors of our established volunteers, and many are Snowbirds. We certainly can't do without them! We even have a guest professional violin player who entertains us during lunch before he eats. We would like to have a few more people come in and just sit at the tables on Fridays with our guests, get to know them, and make conversation, helping them with questions or problems. We have people from nine Central and South American countries as our guests. On most Fridays we have English lessons, and a Spanish speaking volunteer for immediate questions.

WHO WE SUPPORT In addition to what we do on a weekly basis, Soup Kitchen also provides support for Beaufort County's program, Family Promise, 2-3 times a month; a Circles Meal 2 times a year (Break the Circle of Poverty), and we have presented Make-a-Meal at several community events, such as WAHHI and the Women of St. Francis. The presentation's focus is to make our island groups aware of poverty on Hilton Head, how important our local Second Helpings is to our community, and how we together are trying to help our at-risk island population. At the presentations, we ask for donations of items, financial support, and their time to volunteer.

It is a pleasure to volunteer for the Soup Kitchen. It brings great joy in knowing we can give those in need a hand up. We have been asked by God to love our neighbor and to feed and clothe the poor. With God's help we are trying to do just that every week.



Every child deserves to experience the joy of Christmas morning. **CHRISTMAS GRACE ANGEL TREE PROGRAM** helps provide Christmas gifts for registered children in our island community.

Capital Spending Update

Charged with taking appropriate care of our church buildings and facilities, the Trustees have been diligently evaluating some critical maintenance requirements. Our 50+ year old property is showing its age. And, unfortunately the upkeep is expensive!

Our Administration building is in need of a new roof as we can no longer keep patching leaks. The parking lot near the sanctuary has become incapable of properly handling the drainage from all the recent rains. The Celebration Center activities have grown to the point that an additional water heater is required. In addition, investments to improve safety and security around our property have become more urgent. These and other projects can quickly approach \$250,000.

While St. Andrew leadership has strived to maintain a capital reserve sufficient to cover the ongoing repair and maintenance of our property, it is critical that we also replenish these funds over time. We are fortunate to be able to cover the current needs, but other needs surface quickly.

As you contemplate your 2026 stewardship pledge, please consider the ongoing requirements to maintain our church and help replenish our reserve.
