St. Andrew Soup Kitchen Serving Our South Island Neighbors

Our Mission and Impact

The St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen is dedicated to providing food, fellowship, and financial stability for our South Island neighbors. Since November 2010, we have had the privilege of distributing God's gracious gifts of time, talent, and financial generosity two days a week, every week. Today, over 60 volunteers from across the island contribute their energy, making them the heroes of the St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen. Their spirited commitment is reflected in the grateful smiles of our guests.

Our guests benefit from a range of services including food, lunches, clothing, hygiene products, diapers, bikes, and English lessons. In 2025, 89% of our expenditures were directly allocated to meeting the needs of guest families. By providing these essentials, we support our guests' financial stability, enabling them to reallocate their saved dollars toward other important family responsibilities such as transportation and housing.

A Year in Review

As the St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen begins its 16th year, we reflect on the accomplishments of 2025.

Groceries: We provided groceries for 14,000 people. Our Harvest Table distributed groceries with a retail value of \$4,000 per week, totaling over \$200,000 worth of food in 2025. For the 50 households we serve, each saves over \$4,000 on food, which can be allocated to other necessities. Our key partners, Second Helpings and Deep Well, supply over 80% of the food for our Harvest Table. We are deeply grateful for their generosity and support.

Lunches: In 2025, we prepared over 8,800 lunches—bagged lunches on Tuesdays and hot, sit-down lunches on Fridays. St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen is the only food pantry on Hilton Head serving lunches, expertly prepared by our volunteer chefs. The cost per nutritious lunch was \$1.90.

Clothing: Each week, we distribute over 200 pieces of clothing for women, men, and children, amounting to more than 10,000 clothing items annually. Valued at approximately \$3 each, this represents over \$30,000 in clothing provided to our guest families. Clothing is supplied by St. Francis Thrift, Church Mouse, and individual donations, making it our second most important service after food distribution.

Additional Services: We supply diapers for around 15 registered children, totaling \$9,000 per year; hygiene products such as laundry detergent, shampoo, toothpaste, and soap valued at \$3,000 per year; 50 donated bicycles; and conversational English classes to help guests seek better job opportunities.

The value of the St. Andrew By-The-Sea Soup Kitchen to our guest community is clear, not only in dollars but in the support and fellowship we provide. Our services continue to be offered twice a week in the Celebration Center—a welcoming and safe space that conveys dignity and friendship.

Looking Ahead

In 2026, our goal is to continue and develop our mission. We anticipate focusing our energies and resources in four key areas:

1. Serving an additional 8–10 households by expanding communication about our services to the south island communities.
2. Transforming our Harvest Table food distribution into a “mini grocery store,” consistently offering meat, dairy, milk, vegetables, produce, fruit, canned goods, eggs, rice, beans, pasta, sweets, and bread on an all-you-need basis twice weekly on Tuesdays and Fridays.
3. Adding workbooks and similar resources to improve English fluency. With 80% of our guest families being Hispanic and primarily Spanish-speaking, we aim to provide a friendly, safe environment for practicing English, reducing language barriers between volunteers and guests.
4. Increasing volunteer and guest fellowship through activities such as English conversational classes and Bible study groups.

We look forward to a fantastic and wonderful year in 2026. We sincerely appreciate the community support and donations that empower our volunteers to achieve these goals. Our guest community is deeply thankful for the continued generosity.

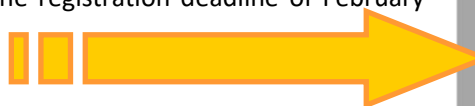

CAMPBELL CHAPEL A.M.E.

Built in 1853, this was originally Bluffton Methodist Episcopal Church. Organized by whites, the church's 216 members in 1861 included 181 African Americans, who were likely enslaved to its white congregants. The church caught fire during the Civil War but survived. By 1874, local freed people began worshipping here as an African Methodist Episcopal (A.M.E.) Church eventually known as Campbell Chapel.

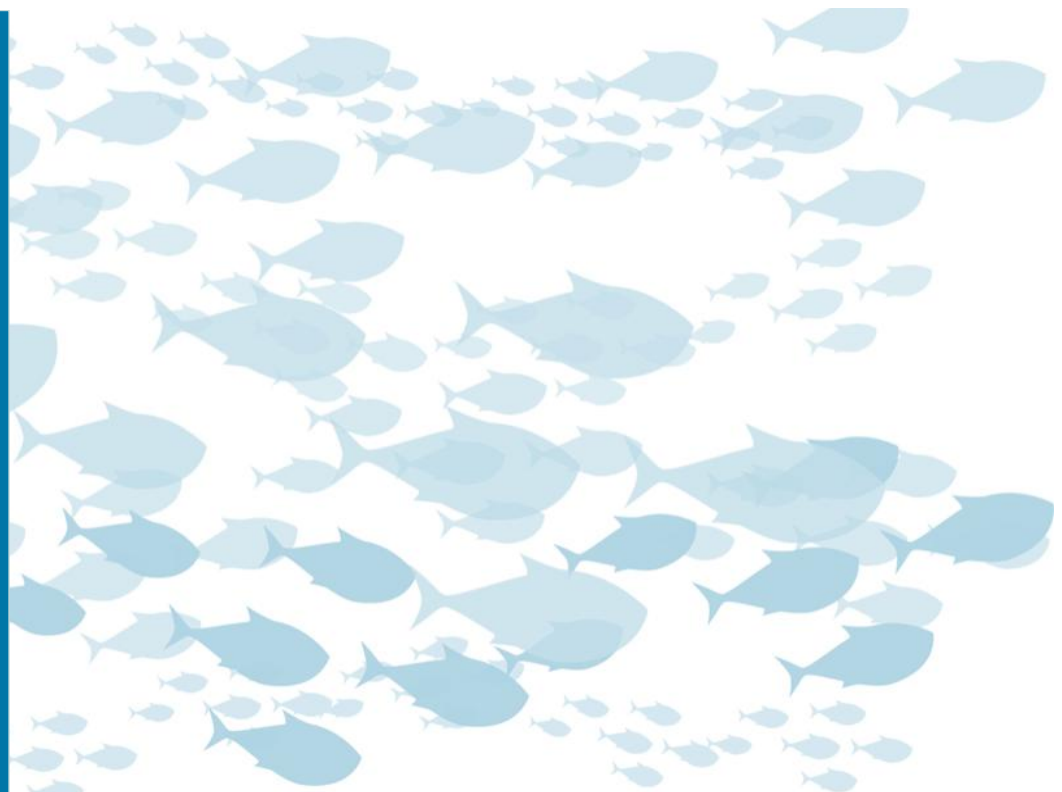
